Town would appoint a future time for the Sale of the Jews, in the New Meeting House, if pass'd in the Affirmative, and the first Monday in February, was the Day appointed, for ^{the} purpose at 1 O'clock, ~~afternoon~~, ^{on} said Day, then to meet at this place.

Then Voted, that ten per Cent, be paid down, by the Purchasers of the Jews, at the time of Sale.

Then Voted, to Adjourn, this Meeting, to the first Monday in February, 12 O'clock, at Noon, to meet at this place.

Sudbury Monday the 6th Day of February 1792

The Town being Mett, agreeable to the foregoing adjournment. - proceeded, and the Question was asked, to see whether, the Town, would reconsider, the Vote, relative to the payment of ten per cent: - at the Sale of the Jews, and it passed in the Negative.

Then Voted, to Dissolve this Meeting.

These are to Notify and warn all the Freeholders, & other Inhabitants, of the Town of Sudbury, Qualified as the Law direct, to vote in Town Affairs, to meet at the Meeting-House, in said Town on Monday the 3rd Day of March next, at 1 O'clock, afternoon, on said Day, then & there.

1st To choose a Moderator, Town Clerk, Selectmen, Town Treasurer, & Soper, Constable, & all other Town Officers, required by Law, to be annually chosen, in the Month, of March or of April.

2^d To see, if the Town, will repair their Highways by a Rate, the present Year, & Grant a suitable Sum of Money, for repairing the same.
