5th The Question, was asked, to see if the Town
would Grant, the Sum of One Hundred, & Fifty
four Pounds, and Nine pence, for the purpose express^d
in this Article: - And it pass'd, in the Affirmative.

— Then the Town, by their Vote, Ordered the Treas^r
to give, M^r Biglow, - a Note of Hand, for the
above Sum, - payable in one Year, with Interest,
if not paid, in that Time.

— Then Voted, to choose two persons, to prepare
the Writings, above Mentioned, and Capt. Joseph
Goodenow, & M^r Isaac Maynard, were chosen.

— Then Voted, to adjourn this Meeting, for the
space of half an Hour, then to meet at Aaron
Johnson's. - The Town, being Met, agreeable to the
aforegoing Adjournment: - proceeded & accepted,
the Writing, above Mentioned. & Ordered, the
Discharge, to be recorded, in the Town's Book.

— Then the Question, was Asked, to see if the Town
would Order the Assessors, to make the Grant, made
to M^r Biglow, - into a Seperate, Plate, and it
pass'd, in the Negative.

— Then the Town, Ordered, the Assessors, to make
the severall Sums, of Money, granted at this
Meeting, into a Plate forthwith.

— Then the Question, was asked to see, if the Town
would reconsider, their proceedings, on the second
Article: - and it pass'd in the Affirmative.

— Then the Question, was asked, to see, if the Town, would
Grant the sum of Thirty Pounds, for the purpose, of
enabling, their Agents, to defend the Town, against
an Action, brought, by the Town of Northborough,
they being Accountable for the same, and it pass'd, in
the Affirmative.

— Then Voted, to give the Agents, discretionary power,
to conduct the Matter, respecting the above Action,
as they shall think best.
