These are to Notify, and Warn, all the Freeholders, & Other Inhabitants, of the Town of Sudbury, Qualified, as the Law Directs, to Vote, in Town affairs, to Meet, at the Meeting House, in Said Town, On Monday, the 6th day of January Next, at 1 o'clock Afternoon, on Said day, then and there, —

1st To Choose a Moderator, and See, if the Town, will Erent a new Meeting House, in Said Town, as Near the Centre of Travil, as the Circumstances of the Land will admit of Do Or Act, as the town shall think best when Mett. —

2^d To See, if the Town, will Choose a Committee, for the purpose, of finding the Centre of Travil, in Said Town Do or act, &c

3^d To See, if the Town, will Grant a Suitable Sum of Money, for the purpose of Building said House, Agreeable to the Petition of Lt. Hopstall Willin, & Others, Reference thereto being had, Do Or act &c —

Sudbury 6th Jan^y 1794. The Town, being Mett Agreeable to the foregoing Warning, Proceeded, to the business of the day, — and Chose Capt Goodenow, Moderator, then proceeded to the 1st Art^e — The Question, was then Askd, to See, if the Town, would Erent a New Meeting House, at the Crook of Lancaster Road, so Called, in S^d Town, — & it passed in the Negative, — The town, then by their vote, passed Over the 1st Art^e, for the present, & took up the 2^d. —
