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Appointed, Hezekiah Johnson, to Do the Service Mentioned in this Article. (During the Towns plea-sure) at the price of 20/ per year, — and provided, the Town, will provide a new Rope, to Ring the Bell with, — he is to keep it in good repair, free of Expence, to the Town, So Long as he shall have the Care thereof.

8th Article, put Over to November Meeting.

9th Voted, to Choose two persons, as Agents, to answer to a Writ of Error, Brought against the Inhabitants of the town of Sudbury, — by Col^l Ezekiel How, & Esquire Joniah Richardson, — and M^r. John Maynard, and Dr Tho^s Walker, were chosen, to appear in Behalf of sd^d Town, & Empowered, to act either Jointly, or Severally, as Circumstances shall Re-quires Necessary.

10th Article, Voted to Choose, two persons as Agents, for the purpose Mentioned in this Article, & William Rice Esq^r was chosen, then the Town, by their vote Ex-cluded Esq^r Rice from serving as an agent, & Capt^t Levi Holden, & Capt^t Joseph Goodenow, were chosen to appear in Behalf of the town, & Empowered, to act either in a Corporate, or Separate Capacity as Circumstances may Render necessary.

The Questⁿ was then put to be, if the Town, would Grant the Sum of 20/ for the purpose of Remitting, to M^r. Henry Smith, & others, their part of the School Money, but passed in the Negative.
