To Mr. Hope Brown, one of the Constables of

These Order you, to Notify & Warn, all the Freeholders, &
Other Inhabitants, (Belonging to your Ward) in Sudbury,
Qualified as the Law directs, to vote, in town affairs
to Meet, at the Meeting House, in said town, on Monday the
2^d Day of March Next, at 1 o'clock afternoon. On said
Day, then & there, — — — — —

1st To Choose a Moderator, Town Clerk, Selectmen, Town
Treas^r, Assessors, Constables, & all other Town Officers,
Required by law, to be Annually chosen in the Months
of March, Or April. — — — — —

2^d To See, if the town, will repair their Highway by a
Rate, the present year, & Grant a suitable sum of Mo-
ney, for Repairing the same. — — — — —

3^d To See, if the town, will give Liberty, for Swine, to
go at Large, the present year, — — — — —

4th To See, if the town, will give Liberty, for Horses, to go
at Large, without letters, any part of the present year,
from the first day of April, to the Last day of Sep-
t^r Next. — — — — —

5th To See, if the town, will give liberty, for Sheep, to go at
Large, from the fifteenth day of March, to the 1st day
of May Next. — — — — —

6th To See, if the town, will accept the Settlement, of the
Selectmen with the town Treas^r, and Order the same
to be Purged, — — — — —

7th To Give in your Votes, for a County Register, that Of-
fice still remaining vacant. — — — — —

8th To See, if the town, will settle accounts, with their
Committee, viz John Maynard & Dⁿ Walker, to the first
of Sep^r 1794 — Agreeable to the Request of said Com^{tee}
Do Or not, as the town shall think proper
