These are to Notify, & Warn, all the Freeholders, & Other Inhabitants, of the Town of Sudbury, duly Qualified, to vote, In the choice of a Representative to Meet, at the Meeting House, in Said town, on Monday the 23^d day of this Instant March, at 4 o'clock, afternoon, On Said day, then & there.

To Give in their Votes, to the Selectmen, for one Representative, that is an Inhabitant, of the Second Middle District, to Represent them, in the Congress of the United States of America, — Agreeable to an Order, from the Governor, of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. —
