7<sup>th</sup> Article, — the 3<sup>rd</sup> Article, as contained in this 7<sup>th</sup> Article, passed Over for the present, 11<sup>th</sup> Article, as contained in this 7<sup>th</sup> Article, passed Over for the present, — 4<sup>th</sup> Article in the Warming of April Meeting, as contained, in this 7<sup>th</sup> Article, passed Over for the present.

8<sup>th</sup> The Town, by vote, appointed Col. Sawin New Barn and yard, adjoining the same, for a pound, for the use of the Town, for the year ensuing.

9<sup>th</sup> The Town, by Vote, Directed their Treas<sup>r</sup> to stay the Action commenced against Aaron Johnson, as Express in this Article, — also Voted, to pay him the Expense he has been at, in prosecuting the Action thus far.

10<sup>th</sup> Voted, that the Major part of their Committee, Chosen to superintend the whole Business, of Building a Meeting-House, be Empowered, to transact the Business, Contained in the Instructions, given to the whole of said Committee — also Directed, their Committee, to reserve a pew, as the property of the Town, for the use of their Rev<sup>d</sup> Minister.
