

December Anno Domini 1795.

Sudbury 7th December, 1795. — The Town being Mett. Agreeable, to the aforesaid Warming, proceeded to the business of said day & made Choice of Col^d Don² Rice for their Moderator, then proceeded to the 2^d Art^e.

2^d Article, The Questⁿ was then put, to see, if the Town, would Grant the sum of 152⁷ Dollars, for the purpose Mentioned in this Article & it pass'd in the Negative.

3^d Art^e. The Questⁿ was then Ask'd to see, if the Town, would Appoint a Com^{tee}, to go out, & view the most suitable spot of Ground, on the Common, whereon to Erect a New Meeting House upon, & report, to the Town, forthwith & it pass'd in the Negative.

— The Questⁿ was then put, to see, if the Town, would remove the present Meeting House, off. of the Ground, it now stands upon and it pass'd in the Negative.

— The Questⁿ was then ask'd to see, if the Town, would sell the present Meeting House, & it pass'd in the Affirmative.

— Then Voted, to Choose a Com^{tee} of three persons, for the purpose of Disposing, of the present Meeting House, & Com^{tee} to Dispose of it in such a Manner, as shall be most, for the Town Interest, Com^{tee} Chosen, were, Col^d Rice, Cap^t Goodenow & Cap^t Levi Holden. — Then Voted, that the Com^{tee} Aforesaid, Dispose of the Meeting House upon such Conditions, that it shall be removed out of the way, by the 10th Day of April Next.

4th Art^e pass'd over for the present.

5th Art^e Granted the sum of Eight Pounds, for the purpose of supplying the several School Houses, with Wood, the year ensuing, to be Equally Divided, between the five School Districts.

4th Art^e Granted the sum of \$ 1. 11. 6. to W^m Wheeler, in full of his services, respecting his Building the Mill Bridge 1-11-6

— Then Voted, that the several Sums of Money, Granted at this and the Last Oct^r Meeting be made into a rate, forthwith.

6th Art^e pass'd over for the present.

— It was then Voted, to Adjourn this Meeting to this Day four Weeks, at 1 o'clock Afternoon, to Meet at this place.

Sudbury Jan^y the 4th 1796. — The Town being Mett. Agreeable, to the aforesaid Adjournment, Voted to pass Over the 2^d Art^e for the present, & pass to the Consideration of the

3^d Art^e. — The Questⁿ was then put, to see if the Town, would Erect the New Meeting House, upon the spot of Ground, where the School House, now stands upon, & it pass'd in the Negative.
