

April Anno Domini, 1797

7th Article, The Town by their Vote, Desired the Selectmen to take & bind out, Isaac Moore's Children, to such Masters, as they shall think most proper, & Suitable to bring up said Children

8th The Town, by Vote, agreed to provide a Carriage, for the Town Use, for the purpose Express in this Article - also by their Vote, appointed William Rice Esq^r to procure said Carriage, & the Apparatus which shall appear to be decent & Necessary for the same.

Then the Town by their Vote, Dissolved this Meeting.

These are to Notify, & Warn, all the Freeholders, & Other Inhabitants, of the Town of Sudbury, Qualified & = greable to the Constitution of this Common Wealth, to Vote, in the choice of a representative, & all others, Qualified, as the Law directs, to Vote in Town affairs, to Meet, at the Meeting House, in said Town, on Monday the 1st Day of May Next, at 1 o'clock afternoon, on said Day then & there

1st To Elect, or Depute, Some Suitable Person, being a Freeholder, & resident, in said Town, to serve for, & represent said Town, in a Great & General Court, appointed to be convened, held & kept, for the service of this commonwealth, at the State House, in Boston, on ~~Monday~~ Wednesday the 31st Day of May Next,

2nd To Choose a Moderator.

3rd To see, if the Town, will take Measures, to prevent Peter Smith, becoming Expensive to said Town, Do or act as the Town shall think proper when Met
