7th the, 19th Article in the Warrning of Oct^r Meeting, as contained in this 7th Article — Granted, the sum of three Hundred Dollars, for the purpose of Leveling the ground, round the Meeting-House, & ordered said Grant, to be made into a rate forthwith, — It was also Voted, to appoint a Com^{tee} of eight persons, for the purpose of Superintending the Leveling the ground around the Meeting-House, & the following persons were chosen, Viz^t. Sgt. Rice, Dr^r. Noyes, Cap^t. Goodnow, M^r. Abiel Babcock, Cap^t. Levi Holden, Lt. David How, Cap^t. Wheeler, & M^r. Wm. Brown, — also Voted, that the price of Labour, be Nine pence pr. Hour, for a man, & Nine pence pr. Hour, for a good yoke of oxen & Cart, During the time they shall be in Service — — —
8th Article, Voted, to choose a Committee, of three persons, for the purpose of Looking into the propriety, of the Claims, of the proprietors, respecting a piece of Land adjoining the East End of the Common, Near the Meeting-House and report to the Town, a State of Facts, at April Meeting, Com^{tee} appointed, were Sgt. Rice, Cap^t. Puffer & Dr^r. Walker, — Then Sgt. Rice, Declined Serving on said Committee, & Col. Rice was appointed, in his stead, — It was then Voted, that all the Articles, which have not been acted upon, Contained in this Warrant, be Deferred to April Meeting, for further Consideration — — —
— Then the Town, by their Vote, Dissolved this Meeting.
