8th Article, The Question, was put, to see, if the Town, would take any Measures, for Erecting a Newbury House in the Centre district, as mentioned in this Article & it passed in the Negative

9th Vote, to Provide a Carriage, for the purposes Express in this Article — also appointed Capt. Sam^l Knight to Procure said Carriage, together with the Apparatus, which shall appear to be decent, & Necessary for the same — Then the Town, by their Vote Dissolved, this Meeting —

1st To Choose a Moderator, —
2^d To see, if the Town, will Accept of a Highway, as Laid out by the Selectmen, through the Land of Lt. Israel Smith, to Stow, Line, Near to Mr. Benjamin Smiths Mill, Do or act, as the Town shall think proper when Met.

3^d To see, if the Town, will take any Measures, with Regard to a Settlement with John Richardson, of Concord, for his Boarding of Lt. Peter Smith, or give such Instructions, to their Select-Men, as they shall think proper, with Regard to the aforesaid Settlement, when Met. Do or act, &c.
