

November Anno Domini 1798.

6th Article, It was then voted, to appoint a Committee, of three Persons, for the purpose of Dividing the Stone wall, upon the South side & West End, of the Burying-yard, with Emign Ruben Rice, & report to the Town, as soon as may be, Committee appointed, were Cap^t Levi Holden, D^r Tho^s. Walker, & Mr. Eben^r. Plympton, — attended to the report, of the Committee, — Who Reported, that they had been upon the spot, & made a Division, & Erected Bounds, & that the westerly part of said wall, be the Towns part, to Erect, & Maintain, which report was accepted, —

7th Voted, that the Selectmen, be authorized to act as they shall think most for the Interest of the Town, with regard to Disposing of, or Removing the old School-House, off the Common, in the Centre district, in said Town, —

8th Voted, that the Town Clerk, be Directed, to provide a Blank Book, for the purpose of Recording Deeds of the sale of Town, & Bring in his account to the Town, for allowance & payment, —

9th Voted, to appoint one Person as an agent, for the Purposes Mentioned in this Article, & Col^d. Jon^a. Rice was chosen — It was then voted, to add one person More to said Committee, & Cap^t Asahel Wheeler, was appointed, & Empowered to act in behalf of said Town, either in a Corporate, or separate capacity, as they shall Judge most Necessary, — also Voted, that the Town should Indemnify said agents, in their Procedure, — also Granted — The sum of 30, Dollars, for the Purpose of Enabling their agents, to Defend the Town, against the action of John Richardson & Co., as set forth in this Ninth article, — \$ 30, —

10th Passed, in the Negative — Then the Town by their Vote took up the 6th Article again

6th & Voted, to choose a Committee of three Persons, for the purpose of Building the Town part of a Stone Wall, round the Burying yard, in said Town, Com^{tee} appointed, were Mr. Hope Brown, Mr. John Brigham, & Lt. Hopkitt Willis — also Voted that said Committee be Empowered, to Build, or Lett out the Building said Wall, to such person, or Persons, as will do it Most to the advantage of the Town, —
