II To choose a Moderator.

III To see if the Town will accept of a Road as laid out by the Selectmen from a Road formerly laid out by the Selectmen from Dea. Thomas Walker's Lane towards Mr. Ephraim Moore's Mill from thence to the Road leading from Mr. Jonathan Fairbank's to the Meetinghouse, agreeable to the request of Dea. Thomas Walker & others, &c. or not, &c.
