11th Article, The Question, was put to see, if the Town would put Over this article to April Meeting & it Passed in the Negative — The Question was then asked, To see, if the Town, would Grant a sum of Money for the purpose Express in this Article, & it Passed in the Affirmative — Then the Town by their Vote, Granted, the sum of \$20. for the purpose of Hiring some suitable person to teach a Singing School, in said Town, and that said school — ^{shall} Not be Opened, until such time as there shall be thirty subscribers, who shall engage to attend said school during the time said school shall be kept, — also Voted, that there be a Committee of three Persons appointed, for the purpose of Procuring a Master, & Laying out the Money, & Regulating the singing Society, & recommending it to said Singers that they attend, too, & sett in their respective seats, after the school shall be Left off keeping; Committee appointed, were, W. Asahel Wheeler J^r, W. Eben. Thympton, then W. Thympton, was Excused from serving on S^d Committee and L^t. Hopetill Wilks, & L^t. Sam^l. Puffer J^r, were Chosen,
