Brown, of Concord, Capt. John Trowbridge of Framingham,
& Mr. Willard Howe, of East Sudbury to adjudge & deter-
-ine, upon the damages, said Goodnow, has or may sustain
on account of an alteration of a road made through his land
by a Courts Committee as express in this article (Provided the
same shall be opened) and there Judgment to be final, —
which agreement was accepted by the Vote, of the Town, — also
by their Vote, appointed three persons as a Comm^{tee} to notify
and attend upon said referees, during the time they shall
be attending upon the above mentioned business, — Committee
appointed, were Col. Jon^s. Rice, Mr. Eben^r. Plympton, &
Mr. William Hunt J^r. — Then Mr. Hunt by his desire was
excused from serving as one of the Comm^{tee}, & Deacon Tho^s.
Walker was chosen in his stead. —

11th. Attended to the report, of the Committee appointed for
the purpose of viewing & finding out a shorter & less expen-
-sive way for a road, than that which the Courts Committee
Laid out, from the Riv^d. Mr. Biglows, as far as Mr. Vose's,
— who Reported, that they had made an accurate Measure-
-ment of the intended New road, & likewise of the old road,
as it is now trod, and that the old road, was but five
Rods, & a few links, further in travel than the New, that
they had also viewed & made another Measurement, begin-
-ing at the Riv^d. Mr. Biglows, so continuing in the old
Road, the greatest part of the way, untill it comes to the
bend of the road against Sig^r. Rice's land, then crossing
the road, through the lands of Mr. Vose, & Sig^r. Rice to the south
of said Vose's House, a straight line, untill it comes in to
the road again near Mr. Tower's, which last Measurement,
if there must be any alteration in said road, it is their
Opinion, will be the best, & the least expensive to the
Town —

— It was then voted, to appoint a Comm^{tee} of two persons
(for the purpose of making application to the Court of Gen-
-eral Sessions of the peace, next to be holden at Cam-
-bridge, in & for the County of Middlesex) said Comm^{tee}
-mittee to take such Measures, as they shall think
Most expedient, for the discontinuance of the al-
-teration made in the road, from the Riv^d. Mr. Biglows's
