Bridge, as soon as conveniently may be, & make an estimate of the necessary expense of building said Bridge, & also to examine the Surveyors accounts, respecting the charges he has made, & report to the Town at the adjournment of this Meeting.

It was then Voted, that M^r. John Brigham, should attend to & make such repairs, on the road (as he shall think necessary) from the Guide Board, in the crotch of Road, called Lancaster Road, so on said road, as far, as M^r. Gideon Maynards, & bring in his account, to the Town, for allowance, at the adjournment of this Meeting.

Then Voted, to adjourn this Meeting, to this ^{day} fortnight, at 1 o'clock, afternoon, to Meet, at this place.

Sudbury Monday December, 7th 1801.

The Town being Mett agreeable to the foregoing adjournment, Proceeded, & took up the 13th Article, & referred said article to march Meeting for further consideration.

14th Article, Pass'd over.

15th Voted, that the two Plans, of this Common-wealth, should be put in to suitable, & Handsome Frames, & hung up in some convenient Place, in the Meeting House, in said Town.

also granted, the sum of \$ 1.00 for the purpose of enabling Col^l. Rice, (he having said plans) to procure said Frames.

Granted, to M^r. Luther Goodnow, the sum of \$ 168. 50. for the purpose of compensating him for the alteration of a road, made through his land, by a Com^{tee} Committee, which sum is agreeable to the report of the referees, who were agreed upon, for the purpose of settling Damages.

Then Voted, to Adjourn this Meeting, to the wid^d.

Ruth Rice, Inhabitant, in said Town, to Meet again as soon, as May be. The Town being Mett agreeable to the foregoing adjournment, Proceeded, & attended, to the report, of this Committee, appointed for the purpose of Viewing & making an estimate of the expense of Rebuilding Wash Bridge &c., - who reported, that it was their Opinion, said Bridge, might be Rebuilt, in the way it appears to be done, for the sum of \$ 45. 25.
