It was then Voted, to pass over the choice of Constables, for the present, & take up the 14th Article,

14th Article, Voted, to let out the collecting the Town Taxes, to such person, or persons, as will do it the lowest on the Pound, he or they, promising good & sufficient Bonds- men, for the payment of the Money, they shall have authority to collect in to the Town Treasury & Lt Sam^l Puffer Jr being the lowest bidder undertook to collect the whole of the Taxes in said Town at four pence on the pound.

Then the Town by Mr. Puffer's consent let out the collecting the Taxes, in the South Ward, to Ezekiel H. Loring at the same price. Then the Town by their Vote, appointed Lt Sam^l Puffer Jr Constable for the North Ward & Mr. Ezekiel H. Loring, Constable for the South Ward. who have both been sworn into Office by the Clerk of said Town.
