

April Anno Domini 1802

These are to Notify, & Warn, all the Freeholders, & Other Inhabitants, of the Town of Sudbury, Qualified, as is provided in the Constitution of this Commonwealth, to Vote in the choice of a Gov^t. Lt. Gov^t. & Senators, for the Year ensuing, and all Others, Qualified as the Law directs, to Vote, in Town affairs, to Meet, at the Meeting House, in said Town, on Monday, the 5th Day of April Next, at 1. o'Clock Afternoon on said day, then & there.

1st To Bring in their Votes, for Gov^t. Lt. Gov^t. & Senators, for the Year ensuing

2^d To Choose a Moderator, & act upon the 6th & 11th Articles in the Warning of March Meeting, & refer'd to April Meeting, for further Consideration

3^d To fill up Vacancies in those Town Offices which the Law requires, should any Office appear to be Vacant, &c.

4th To see, if the Town, will attend to any or all the reports of their Committees which were directed to make their Reports at April Meeting, Do. or act &c.

5th To see, if the Town, Agreeable to the Request of Capt. Torrey Bent, will accept of the Road, as it is now trod, beginning at the North-easterly corner of said Bent's House, so running as the fence now stands, to the lower corner of said Bent's fence, near Cold Brook Causeway. (so called) said Road to be two Rods wide, & on the Easterly side of the afovermentioned fence — and in Lieu thereof to give to him the said Bent, the Land Laid out for a Highway, in Exchange, — said way being Laid out two Rods wide, & Bounded on the Gulf Meadow Bottom, the whole length of the abovermentioned Line, Do. or act &c.

6th To see, if the Town, will give any Encouragement, for the destroying of Crows & Other Mischivous Birds — that pull up the young plants of Corn. Do. or act &c.

7th To see, if the Town, will take any Measures, for Railing their part of the Long Causeway, Do. or act &c.
