

May Anno Domini 1802, -

- Reported - that it was their Opinion, that if there should be a Considerable Number of Willow trees set out by the side of the Causeway, it might answer a valuable purpose, or if that there were Large rocks placed on the side of the Causeway, & Holes drilled into the rocks, & Large poles key'd Down with Iron Bolts, that might answer the purpose -
- 2^d Then the Town by their Vote Directed the aforementioned Committee to Carry the setting of Willow trees by the side of the causeway, into effect. -
- 6th Then the Town took up this sixth Article, & attended to the report of the Committee appointed for the purpose of seeing upon what Conditions, they could let out the making the road, through the Lands of Mr. Luther Goodnow, & others - who Reported that General Sawin, came forward, & made propositions - that he would ~~make~~ undertake to make the Road, the whole distance of way, through said Land, for the sum of five Dollars per Rod Mr. Luther Goodnow Mentioned, that he had made some calculations respecting the expence of making said road, & that he would undertake said way, for three Dollars, & Sixty cents per Rod - It was then Voted, that the Commission of the aforesaid Committee be extended, to the adjournment of this Meeting, for the purpose of taking proposals Respecting the making of Road, Should any person, be disposed so to do -
- 3^d Accepted of the alteration of the Road, as Mentioned in this Article, & Ordered the same to be recorded. -
- Then the Town by their Vote adjourned this Meeting to this day three weeks, at 4 o'clock afternoon, to meet at this place. -

- Then the Town being Mett agreeable to the foregoing adjournment Provided, to the consideration of the 4th Article and by their Vote gave Mr. John Brigham Liberty to curb the Road Mentioned in this Article, During the Towns pleasure -
