9th Voted, to Grant a suitable sum of Money, for the pur-

then put, to see if the Town, would Grant the sum of
\$100, for the purpose of Repairing the Highways to be
put in to some Particular Mens Hands, that will expend
said Grant, upon such parts of the Public Roads in said
Town, as appears to them, Most Necessary to be repair-
ed, — & it pass'd in the Negative —

— It was then Mov'd & Seconded that the sum of \$150 be
Granted for the repairs of Highways, said Money to be put
in to the Selectmens hands, for them to Lay out upon the
Public roads in such parts of the Town as to them ap-
pears, most Necessary to be Repair'd, & it pass'd in the
Negative —

— The Question was then put, to see if the Town, would
appoint a Committee, for the purpose of Viewing the
Public roads in said Town, & to make such repairs
as they shall think Necessary to answer the purpose
for the present season & it pass'd in the affirmative
— also Voted, that the Selectmen be a Committee for
the purpose above-Mentioned, & to bring in their accounts
to the Town, for allowance, at the adjournment of
this Meeting, —

— Then Voted, to adjourn this Meeting to this day four
weeks at 1 o'clock afternoon, to meet at this place —

— The Town being Met, agreeable to the foregoing ad-
