10th Granted the sum of \$100 for the purpose of defraying the expense, that has arisen in consequence of a Law suit, Instituted by the Town of Concord against the Town of Sudbury, for the support of Peter Smith

2^a The Town by their vote, took up this 2^d Article again and - Granted the sum of \$86.67 for the purpose of supplying of preaching, in the Town of Sudbury, for the year ensuing, said Grant to be Drawn by an Order, from the selectmen and apply'd for that purpose, to the Revd. M^r. Biglow if he supplies the pulpit himself, or if it is done by his Providing, - Otherwise to be under the direction of the selectmen, for them to provide some person to preach, in case M^r. Biglow is unable, & to be appropriated, for the purpose last mentioned,

Then voted, to appoint a Committee of three persons for the purpose of enquiring into the probability of obtaining any encouragement, by way of Subscription, towards the making a road from M^r. Luther Goodnows so on across his River Meadow lot & others to East Sudbury Line it being in a straight line to the Canal Bridge Committee appointed, were Capt. Goodnow, Capt. Wheeler & M^r. Luther Goodnow, & to Report to the Town at the adjournment, of this Meeting

Then the Town, by their vote, adjourn'd this Meeting to Tuesday the 9th day of this Instant Nov^r at 1 o'clock afternoon to meet at this place) Sudbury Nov^r 9th 1802

The Town being well agreeable to the foregoing adjournment provided & allow'd accounts, as follows, viz^t

Allow'd To Capt. Joseph Goodnow, as agent for the Town to oppose the Laying out a Road in the Northerly part of the Town for time & expenses & Cash paid to Artemas Ward Esq^r from March 1802 to Sept^r term following \$34.37 - to setting of Willow trees beside the Long Causeway \$1.
To M^r. Jesse Goodnow, for his paying John Brown, his poll tax for the year 1800 - \$2.24
