There are to Notify, & warn, all the Freeholders, & Other Inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury, qualified in the Law respects, to Vote, in Town affairs, to Meet, at the Meeting-House in said Town, on Monday the 13th day of December Next at 2 o'clock Afternoon, on said day, then & there, to act on the following Articles, Vizt.

1st To Choose a Moderator,

2^d To see, if the Town, will direct their Committee, & the undertakers of the Road, (that was Laid out (by a courts Committee, & accepted in May term, 1801) through the Land of M^r Luther Goodnow & Others, to suspend the making said Road, until such time as the Petitioners, for a courts Committee, to Review the Premises, may have an opportunity, to be heard, at the adjournment of Nov^r Court, Agreeable to the Petition of M^r John Taylor & Others, & forasmuch therunto being had, to do or act as the Town shall think best when Met,

3^d To see, if the Town, will take any Measures for Making, or defraying the Expence of the road, or any part thereof, that was Laid out (by a courts Committee, and accepted in May term 1802) in the Northerly part of the Town, Beginning at Stow Line, & on by M^r Isaac Puffer, to Concord Line, Agreeable to the request of M^r Isaac Puffer, & Others, - do - or - act &c.
