

April Anno Domini 1804.

There are to Notify & Warn, all the Freeholders & Other Inhabitants, of the Town of Sudbury, Qualified as is Provided, in the Constitution of this Commonwealth, to Vote in the choice of a Governor, Lt. Gov. & Senators for the year ensuing, — and all Others, Qualified as the Law directs to Vote, in Town Affairs, to Meet, at the Meeting House in said Town, on Monday the 2^d Day of April Next, at 1 o'clock, in the afternoon, on said Day then & there, —

1st To Bring in their Votes, for Gov. Lt. Gov. & Senators, for the year ensuing. —

2^d To Choose a Moderator & act upon the 6th Article in the warning of March Meeting, & Refer'd to April Meeting, for further consideration. —

3^d To fill up Vacancies, in those Town Offices, which the Law requires, should any Office appear to be Vacant. —

4th To see, if the Town will appoint an agent, or agents, to appear in behalf of the Town, at the Court of Common Pleas Next to be holden at Concord, in & for the County of Middlesex, in May term, Next ensuing, & so on as Occasion may require, at any other Court, in Order to support any ^{action} Instituted by said Town, against Peter Smith — said action being brought, in consequence of said Peters being chargeable to said Town, whilst confin'd, in Concord Goal, to do, or act, as the Town shall think best when Met. —

5th To see, if the Town, will Agreeable to the request of Mr. Sylbetta Now, exempt him from paying his proportion, of the Highway Taxes, the present year. — To do, or act, &c. &c. —

6th To see, if the Town, will give liberty for Neat Cattle to go at large the present year, — Agreeable to the request of Mr. Loving Wheeler. — To do, or act, &c. &c. —
