

May Anno Domini 1804.

At a Town Meeting Legally held in Sudbury, on Monday the 7th Day of May 1804, Proceeded to the business of said day, & Voted to send a Representative, to Represent them in General Court the year ensuing

Then proceeded, to bring in their Votes, for the choice of a Representative, as Follows - Viz -

Fourth Time Then the Town by their Vote made choice of Capt. Joseph Goodnow, being a Freeholder, & Resident in said Town, to serve for & Represent said Town in General Court, the year ensuing, having the Number of 67 Votes -

Candidate M^r. William Hunt 60 - Do

1st Article made choice of M^r. William Hunt, for their Moderator.

4th Article, in the warning of April Meeting, as contain'd in this 1st Article, - It was Voted, to appoint two persons as agents, to appear in behalf of said Town, at the Court of common pleas, Next to be holden at Concord &c, as express in this Article, & Col^o. Jona Rice and Major Jonas Holden was appointed, & authorized to act either in a Corporate or separate Capacity as circumstances shall render necessary.

2^d Article, The Question was put, to see if the Town would take any Measures, for Opening & making the road as express in this Article & it pass'd in the Negative.
