would give Liberty, for such Cattle to go at Large in said Town, as the Selectmen, or a Committee, appointed for that purpose, should license, the Owners of said Cattle to be answerable, for the damage, that might arise in consequence of said Cattle proving unruly, &c. & it passed in the Negative.

4th Voted, that Horses, should not be suffered to go at Large without a keeper.

5th Voted, that the same Encouragement be given to those persons, who shall destroy Crows, as was given the last year, also to be under the same Rules & Regulations, with regard to the limits &c.

6th Article, passed in the Negative.

7th Voted, to appoint, One person, as an agent, to appear in behalf of said Town, (at the Court of General Sessions, next to be holden at Concord, in & for the County of Middlesex,) in Order to obtain the discontinuance of the Road mentioned in this article, & Capt. Joseph Goodnow was appointed, & authorized, for the purposes above-mentioned.

8th Referred, to next Oct. Meeting for further consideration.

9th passed in the Negative.

10th Voted, that the Selectmen, be directed, to purchase the Stone, mentioned in this article, if in their Opinion it appear necessary, and for the Interest of the Town.

11th Voted, that it be left discretionary with the Selectmen, to act as they shall think best, respecting setting Willows trees, as Express in this article.

Then Voted, to Dissolve this Meeting.
