

October Anno Domini 1804.

10th Article, Granted the sum of \$ 17.19. for the purpose of repairing the several School-houses in said Town, & the Committee who were appointed, at the Opening of this Meeting, were directed to make all necessary repairs, and to be accountable to the Town, for the expenditure of the aforesaid Grant.

8th Article refer'd to March Meeting for further consideration.

9th then the Town took up the 9th article, & Granted the sum of \$ 212. for the purpose of repairing & painting the Meeting-House, as expressed in this article.

11th Granted the sum of \$ 64. for the purpose of erecting a wall upon each side of Sherman's Bridge causeway (so called) also by their vote authorized their Committee (who were appointed for the purpose of viewing & letting out the causeway as expressed in this article) to let out the making said wall, to such person, or persons, as will do it the cheapest, & will answer every purpose, contemplated in erecting said wall - also voted, that said committee be accountable to the Town for the expenditure thereof.

Allowed To Mr. Moses Maynard, for Timber & plank for the upper part of Bridge, \$ 1.50.

To Mr. Asa Maynard, for his plow three days, on the Highways, at 5/8 pr. Day.

To Mr. William Brown, for 64 feet white Oak plank at \$ 4.50 pr. Hundred.

To Mr. Jonathan Fairbank, for 7 lights of glass 7 by 9 at ten cents each, found for South west School-house.

To Mr. William Hunt, for a Journey to Boston Respecting Micah Rice, 2.50, for advice, to James Sullivan Esq.

\$ 5. for a Copy of a Deed to the Register \$ 83, to Asa Ward, for advice \$ 2. for 150 feet white Oak plank

\$ 7.50. for 8 Squares of 7 by 9 glass for the School

House in the N. East district - \$ 64.
