

November Anno Domini 1804

6th Article Voted, to appoint a committee of three persons for the purpose of viewing the school-house, as express in this article, & report to the Town their opinion, respecting what alterations, are necessary to be made, & the probable expence, in making said alterations—Committee appointed, were Mr. Isaac Puffer, Lt. Roand Bogle, & Mr. Sam^l Jones, — also Voted, said committee make their report to the Town at the next March Meeting.

7th Voted to appoint a committee of three persons, for the purpose of viewing, & if it appears to them reasonable of making the exchange, of the pieces of Land as mentioned in this article, & to report to the Town their doings thereon, at some future Meeting, — Committee appointed were Col^l Jos^a Rice, Lt. Roand Bogle, and Ensign Josiah Richardson.

4th The Town by their Vote took up this 4th Article again, & after a considerable debate had upon the subject matter of this article, — The Question was put to see, if the Town would appoint a committee, for the purpose of viewing, & letting out the making the road as mentioned in this article, & it passed in the Negative. — The question, was again ask'd to see, if the Town, would appoint a Com^{tee} for the purpose of viewing, & letting out the making the road as mentioned in this article & it again pass'd in the Negative.

Then Voted, to adjourn this meeting, to this day fortnight, at 1 o'clock P.M. to meet at this place,

— Sudbury Monday, Dec^r 3^d 1804, — The Town being mett agreeable to the foregoing adjournment, proceeded, & took up the 5th Article again, and attended to the report of the committee appointed for the purpose of viewing a suitable spot of Land, whereon to set the Room House mentioned in this article — who reported, they had attended to the business for which they were appointed, & it was their Opinion, if said Room House, was moved off to the East, about 8 or 10 feet it appeared to them, it might accomodate Capt Bowker, & not disaccommodate the W^m Moor, &c.
