These are to Notify & Warn, all the Freeholders, & Other Inhabi-
- tants, of the Town of Sudbury, Qualified as the Law directs, to
Vote, in Town affairs, to Meet, at the Meeting-House, in said
Town, on Monday the 4th day of March Next, at 10 o'clock
in the forenoon, on said day then & there, to act on the
following Articles Vizt.

1st To Choose a Moderator, Town Clerk, Selectmen Town Treas^r,
Assessors, Constables, & all other Town officers required by Law

to be annually chosen in the Months of March or April.
2^d To see, if the Town, will repair their Highways by a rate
the present year, & Grant a sum of money for repair
- ing the same

3^d To see, if the Town, will give liberty for Swine to
go at Large the present year.

4th To see, if the Town, will give Liberty for Horses to go
at large without fetters any part of the present year
from the first day of April, to the last Day of September

5th To see, if the Town, will give liberty for Sheep to go at large
from the 15th day of March, to the first Day of May Next.

6th To see, if the Town, will accept the settlement of the V^{er}it-
- men, with the Town Treasurers, & Order the same to be re-
- corded.
