At a Town Meeting legally held in Sudbury, on Monday the 1st Day of April 1805, provided to the business of said day, by bringing in their votes, for the choice of Gov^r Lt. Gov^r & Senators for the year ensuing, as follows -

2^d Article, made choice of M^r William Hunt, for their Moderator

4th Article, in the warning of Nov^r Meeting & refer'd to March Meeting & so on to April Meeting, as contained in this 2^d Article, was by the Towns vote, put over to May Meeting, for further consideration

3^d Article, expul'd Lt. Justice Willis (at his request) from serving as one of the School committee & made choice of Capt. Abner Cutting, to serve in his stead,

4th Article, put over to May Meeting, for further consideration

5th Article, pass'd over, for the present,

6th The Town by their Vote, appropriated the ground, upon which the three seats, upon each side of the pulpit, next the wall, in the body of said House, now occupies, for the purpose of erecting Pews on, as express in this Article - also by their vote appointed a Com^{tee} of three persons, for the purpose of superintending the Building said pews, and authorized them to make sale of said Pews, when completed, in such a way, as will be most for,
