

May Anno Domini 1805.

Then voted, to adjourn this Meeting, to this day fortnight at 1 o'clock, in the afternoon, to meet, at this place.

Sudbury Monday July 1st 1805.

The Town being mett agreeable to the foregoing adjournment proceeded, to attend to the report of the Committee, appointed for the purpose of pointing out the way & manner, of making the road, in the Northerly part of the Town, & receiving proposals, &c. — who reported that they had been on to view said Road, & that there had been proposals made by several persons, for their making certain Pieces of said way, at certain prices, — Viz^t beginning at Concord line thence continuing on said Road, as far as M^r. Isaac Puffers, Amounting to the sum of Between six & seven Hundred dollars, agreeable to their proposals that there was not any person, that came forward for the purpose of making proposals, for the remainder of said road, but it was their Opinion, the other part from M^r. Puffers, to Stow line, would be nearly, if not altogether as Expensive.

Then the Town, took up the 2^d Article, and appropriated, the sum 2^d of \$31, & some odd cents, out of any unappropriated Money, now in the Treasury, for the purpose of Refunding, to M^r. William Hurst the abovesaid sum, it being, in full for what Money he paid to the Selectmen of the Town of Concord, to discharge an amount against the Town of Sudbury, for the support of Rose Benson, a Negro woman, belonging to this Town.

Then voted, to adjourn this Meeting for One hour, then to meet at this place, it being for the purpose of taking up another Warrant, which is necessary to be acted upon this afternoon.

Monday Evening July 1st 1805.

The Town being mett agreeable to the foregoing adjournment proceeded, & voted, to adjourn this Meeting, to the first Monday in September Next, at 1 o'clock in the afternoon, to meet at this place.

Sudbury Monday September 2^d 1805.

The Town, being mett, agreeable to the foregoing adjournment, proceeded & took up the 2^d Article & allowed to M^r. Sam^l. Jones, and others, for Labour done, & Materials found for the Canal Bridge &c. as stands hereafter recorded.

Then the Town, took up the 4th Article again, in the warning of 800th Meeting, & refer'd to March, April, & so on to May Meeting, as contained in this 1st Article, and by this Vote, appointed the selectmen, as a Committee, for the purpose of staking out the ground, in the Northerly part,
