part of the Town, where the New Road is to be made, said Road to be within the limits, of the Courts Committee's laying out, & acceptance — also empowered said Committee to let out the making the several Sluices necessary to be made on said Road to such person, or persons, as will do it the cheapest and most for the Interest of the Town, — also voted, that said Committee be authorized, to receive Materials of every kind necessary for the making said Sluice ways, of any person, who shall be disposed to supply them, & to be discounted, by the Surveyors, in part, towards their Highway Rate, — said Committee, to bring in their accounts to the Town, for the Expense of said Sluice ways, for allowance, at the adjournment of this Meeting —

Then Voted, to adjourn this Meeting to the 1st Monday in October next, at 1 o'clock in the after noon, to meet, at this place,

Sudbury Monday Oct. 7th 1805.

The Town being met, at time & place, agreeable to the foregoing adjournment, proceeded to the business of said day, and allowed a sum — per accounts as Bro^r in by several persons, for services & Materials for Building Sluices on the New road, &c. As stand hereafter recorded —
6th Article, Then the Town took up the 6th Article again and

Granted, the sum of \$ 100. in addition to the grant already made, under this Article for the relief of the poor belonging to said Town, —

Then, the Town, by their vote, directed their Treas^r to pay out of the Treasury any Money that shall remain in his hands and unappropriated, whatever sum of Money shall appear to be deficient in the grant made for the purpose of Repairing, & painting the Meeting House, in said Town, —

It was then Voted, that the several Surveyors of Highways be directed to go on immediately & work out all their Taxes (that remain behind in their hands) upon Waverston, Lancaster, and the New Road in the Norwth part of the Town, — also directed the Selectmen to go on and view said Roads, as soon as said Taxes are worked out upon said roads & report to the Town, a State of facts, relative to their respective situations at the next Town Meeting, —
