10th Article, in the warning of March Meeting and referred to April, as Contain'd in this 2nd Article — Voted, to appoint a Com^{tee} for the purpose Mention'd in this article and the Com^{tee} appointed for a School Committee, were therefore, for the purposes express'd in this article, —

3rd Article, Not any Vacancies appear'd, in those Town offices which the Law requires —

4th Article, Pass'd in the Negative —

5th Article The Town by their Vote, Empower'd the Selectmen, to go on and make such necessary enquiry, for the purpose of ascertaining the bounds of the Road, leading from M^r. Jonathan Fairbanks, to M^r. John Perrys as far as the same goes, as express'd in this article, also to transact the remainder part of the business, that is contain'd Under this article, as to them shall appear Most for the Interest of the Town, and to report to the Town, a State of facts of their Proceedings, at May Meeting Next ensuing —

6th Article Directed the Selectmen, to Erect Guide Posts in such Particular Places in the Town, as they shall Judge necessary, —

7th Article, The Town, by their Vote, directed the Selectmen, for the future, to Discontinue, in their Settlements, with the Town, the sum of \$55. 23, which appears due the Town, previous to the year 1792, — also the Question was put To see if the Town would direct their Treas^r. to call upon the Delinquent Constables and Collectors, for what Monies remain'd Due the Town, in their hands, and it pass'd in the Negative —

8th Article, Pass'd over for the present, and took up the
