

May anno Domini, 1806:—

11th. attended to the report of the Selectmen respecting their ascertaining and laying out a Road from M^r. John Perry's Land, which report was accepted, and ordered to be recorded.

Then the Town by their vote adjourned this Meeting to this day fortnight at 2 o'clock in the afternoon to meet at this place.

Sundbury Monday May 19th 1806

The Town being well agreeable to the foregoing adjournment provided and took up the 12th. Article, and by their Vote directed the Selectmen to Erect such kind of Guides as will be sufficient for the purpose of directing travellers in time of a Flood to pass over this Town proportion of the Long Causeway safe & secure said Guides to be either by setting of Trees, or some other way, that shall answer the purpose.

13th. The Town by their Vote gave the same Encouragement, to those persons who shall destroy Crabs, as was given the year last past, also to be under the same Rules and Regulations, in every Respect &c.

1st. Article, the 9th. Article in the warning of April Meeting as contained in this 1st. Article the Question was put, to see if the Town would direct M^r. Curtis Moore to remove his gates that are erected at the avenues of the road passing by his house, so as that the road shall be an Open road, and it passed in the Negative. — The Question was then put to see, if the Town would direct M^r. Moore to Open said Road within in the term of six Months and it passed in the Negative.

Then the Town by their Vote Directed M^r. Moore, to remove his gates, that are erected, at the avenues of the road passing by his House forthwith, so as that the same shall be free for passing, exclusive of any Immembrane &c.

10th. Article Then the Town, took up this Article again and by their Vote, Reconsidered the Grant made under this Article, for the purpose of enabling the singing Society to provide some suitable Instructor, to teach a singing School. — said Reconsideration was made under the pretence of the Illegality of the proceedings in this one Article only, —
