

November Anno Domini 1806

At a Legal Town Meeting held in Sudbury, on Monday the 13<sup>th</sup> day of Nov<sup>r</sup> 1806 proceeded to the business of said Day, by bringing in their votes, for the choice of a Representative to represent them in the Congress of the United States, as follows, Viz<sup>t</sup> —

Then the Town took up the other Warrant, for the purpose of Transacting Town affairs 1<sup>st</sup> — and by their vote, made choice of M<sup>r</sup> William Hunt for their Moderator —

2<sup>d</sup> Article The Question was put, to see, if the Town would accept of some suitable person for Collector of Taxes, for the present year. Instead of M<sup>r</sup> Abel Moore, as expressed under this article, and it passed in the Negative —

3<sup>d</sup> After a considerable was said respecting what is contained under this article — The Town by their vote, appointed the Selectmen as a Committee, for the purpose of pointing out some suitable Measures, respecting the widening all the public Roads in said Town, also the disposing of such pieces of land as appear unnecessary for Public Use, as expressed in this article — and to report to the Town, their Opinion what will be most for the Interest of the Town as soon as conveniently may be —

— it was then voted, to adjourn this Meeting for a few Minutes, for the purpose of closing the Meeting for the choice of a Representative to Congress. —

Then the Town Resumed this Meeting again agreeable to the foregoing adjournment and took up the 7<sup>th</sup> Article and voted, that whenever their Taxes brought before the Town, by a Constable, or Collector, for allowance, or Discount, — so soon as they are allowed, or Discounted, their Rate Bills shall
