2^d Article Voted, to Repair their Highways by a Rate, the present year, and the sum of One thousand Dollars was granted, for Repairing the same — also (\$1000,) Voted, that the price of labour, with regard to Men, oxen and Carts &c. be the same as was allowed the year last past. Viz^t. Mⁿs Labour 9 p^r. Hour, & one yoke of oxen and Cart at Nine pence p^r. Hour —

1st Article, It was then Moved by M^r. Ezekiel H. Loring that there should be two more Town Viewers in addition to those already chosen, and L^t. Caleb Wheeler, and Cole Don^a. Rice were appointed

7th It was then Voted to appoint a school Committee as express under this article, said Committee to consist of five Persons one to be taken out of each School-district and to be chosen by Ballot, and the following Persons were Chosen, Viz^t. for Centre district Reuben Maynard S. E. District M^r. Thomas Goodnow, S. W. district, Capt. Isaac Gibbs, S. W. district, M^r. William Smith and N. E. district M^r. Moses Maynard Jr. — also Invested them with the same Powers and authorities their school Comm^{tee} were invested with the last year, also Established the same Rules orders, and discipline which were to be observed in each Particular School the year last past.

Then Voted to adjourn this Meeting to this day fortnight at 1 o'clock in the afternoon, to Meet at this place —
