

March Anno Domini 1807.

6th Provided, and took up the 6th Article, (agreeable to 89th River request) and by their vote Recommended the Settlement of the Selectmen, with the Town Treas^r, to their Com^{tee} who settled with their Treas^r, in order that there might be some Errors Rectified, which appeared to be in the Settlement.

6th Then the Town, by their vote, accepted the Settlement of their Com^{tee} with the Town Treas^r, as it is now exhibited, ^{it being rectified} and ordered the same to be recorded.

7th Article, Then the Town (at the Request) of M^r. J^d. Thompson Excluded him from serving as one of the Surveyors of Highways, the present year, — & appointed M^r. James Hunt, in his stead.

8th Voted, to let out the Collecting the Taxes asy^d upon the Inhabitants of said Town, to such person, or persons as will collect them, the lowest p^{er} cent, on the Dollar, and M^r. Abel Moor, being the lowest Bidder undertook to collect the whole of the Taxes asy^d upon the Inhabitants of said Town, for the year ensuing, for two Mills, on the Dollar, — also Voted, that said Collector should procure good and sufficient Bondsman to the acceptance of the Selectmen, and Treasurer, for the payment of ^{all} Monies he shall have authority to collect, in to the State, County and Town Treas^r, — also by their vote made choice of him for their Constable, for the year ensuing.

— It was then Moved by M^r. Moor, that he might be excluded from serving as Collector, of Taxes, and that they might accept of M^r. Ezekiel H. Loring in his Room, by his procuring Bondsman, to the acceptance of Selectmen, &c — and that he might be chosen Constable, which being put to vote, it passed in the Negative.

9th Voted, that the several Surveyors of Highways, for the present year, be directed, to discount to the several persons, who laboured on the new County Road, in the Northerly part of the Town, in the fall of the year 1805, and have not been compensated for their labour, said Surveyors, should allow said people —
