People, in their Rate Bills, Committed to them, whatever sum shall appear to be each Person's due, out of the Highway Grant, for the present year, — — — — —

2^d Article, Voted that there should be an additional sum of Money granted, for the repair of Highways the present year, and the sum of five Hundred dollars was proposed, which being put to vote, it passed in the Negative — — — — —

— Then the sum of \$200, was moved for, which being put to vote, it passed in the affirmative — — — — —

— Then the sum of three Hundred dollars, in addition to the sum already granted, was moved for, and it passed in the Negative — — — — —

— It was then moved by M^r. Isaac Puffer that the sum of \$100, out of the additional Grant of \$200, be appropriated for the express purpose of repairing the New Road in the Northerly part of the Town, which being put to vote, it passed in the Negative — — — — —

10th The Town by their vote Directed the selectmen to take the advice of some able attorney Respecting the perambulating the line, between the Towns of Sudbury, and Stow, — — — — —

11th Referred to April Meeting, for further Consideration. — — — — —

12th Passed Over for the present, — — — — —

13th Passed Over, — — — — —

14th The Question was put, to see, if the Town, would Grant, or Permit, to the several Persons, in the South West and North West School-districts, being Petitioners, their part of the Money, they respectively pay towards the support of Public Schools in said Town, as set forth in this article, and it passed in the Negative — — — — —

12th Then the Town took up this article again, and voted to appoint a Com^{tee} for the purpose of searching the Records, as express in this Article, and to Report to the Town at April Meeting Respecting said business, said Committee to consist of three persons, and the following were appointed, viz^t. Capt. Abel Thompson, Dr. Thos. Walker, and M^r. Abel Moor, — — — — —
