Then the Town at the Request of Mr. Abel Moor, accepted of Mr. Ezekiel H. Loring as Collector of Taxes for the South Ward, in his stead, and to be subject to similar Bonds that S. D. Moor is subject to, for the payment of all Monies into the several Treasuries, &c. — also by this Vote made Choice of him for One of their Constables, — who has since together with said Moor, been sworn into office, by the Clerk of S. D. Town
