

March Anno Domini 1808.

4th Article, To see if the Town will give liberty for horses to go at large without fetters, any part of the present year from the first day of April, to the last Day of September.

5th To see if the Town, will give Liberty for sheep to go at large, from the 15th Day of March, to the first Day of May next.

6th To see, if the Town, will accept the settlement of the selectmen, with the Town Treasurer, and Order the same to be recorded.

7th To see, if the Town, will appoint some suitable persons for a school Committee, and authorise them, to agree with, and hire school Instructors, to instruct the public schools in said Town, the year ensuing, to do - or act as the Town shall think best when met.

8th To see, if the Town, will take any Measures, for the purpose of agreeing with some suitable person, or persons, for Collector, or Collectors, to collect the Taxes specified, upon the Inhabitants of said Town, for the year ensuing, to do - or act, &c &c.

9th To see, if the Town, will make any provision, for the purpose of making compensation to Capt. Jesse Goodnow, (of Roxbury) for the loss of a Horse, that had his leg broken in the Stone Shute near Dorr's Riders, to do - or act, any other way, on this article, as the Town shall think best when met.

10th To see if the Town will attend to any, or all the reports to be made by committees, should any such reports, be offered to be made, to do - or act &c.
