

April Anno Domini 1808.

There are to notify and warn, all the Freeholders —
Inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury, Qualified by law, as
is provided in the Constitution of this Commonwealth, to vote
in the choice of Gov^r, Lieut. Gov^r, and Senators, for the year
ensuing, to meet, at the Meeting House in said Town, on
Monday the 4th Day of April next, at 1 o'clock in the after-
noon, on said Day, to give in their votes, for the choice of
Gov^r, Lt. Gov^r, and Senators for the year ensuing.

Also all the Freeholders, and other Inhabitants of the
Town of Sudbury, Qualified as the law directs to vote, in Town
affairs, to meet, at the abovementioned place at 2 o'clock in
the afternoon, to act on the following Articles viz^t —

- 1st To Choose a Moderator, and act upon the 6th Article in
the warning of March Meeting and refer to April Meet-
ing for further consideration.
- 2^d To bring in their votes, for some suitable person, for a Coun-
ty Treasurer.
- 3^d To fill up vacancies in those Town Offices, which the law
requires, should any office appear to be vacant.
- 4th To see if the Town, will, agreeable to the request of L^t
Rupert Willis, Direct their Assessors, to go ^{to} the several In-
habitants belonging to said Town, and liable to be Taxed, to
take an Invoice, of all their Personal Estate, to do, or act,
as the Town shall think best when Met.
- 5th To see, if the Town will, agreeable to the request of M^r Mi-
chael Balcom, take any Measures, for the purpose of rest-
raining Neat Cattle & Horses, going at large without a keep-
er, the present Season, to do - or act &c &c.
- 6th To see, if the Town, will attend to the reports to be made by
Committees, should any reports be offered to be made to
do - or act &c &c.
- 7th To see if the Town, will devise Means whereby the Poor
belonging to said Town, may be rendered less expen-
sive, it being agreeable to the request of M^r.
