At a Legal Town Meeting held in Sudbury on Monday the 2^d Day of May, 1808, Provided to the business of said Day by bringing in their Votes, for the choice of a Representative, and Mr. William Hunt, being a Freeholder, and resident in said Town, was made choice of, to serve for and Represent said Town, in General Court for the year ensuing having the N^o. of 75. Votes,

1st Then provided to the first article and made choice of Mr. William Hunt, for their Moderator

2^d Article Pass^d over for the present
3^d Article Granted the sum of \$246. 67. as a salary to the Rev. Mr. Biglow, for the year ensuing - 246. 67

also Granted as a Gratuity to their Rev. Minister the sum of \$86. 67 provided he superintend the pulpit for the year ensuing - 86. 67

4th & 5th Articles Granted the sum of \$500. for the support of Public schools, in said Town for the year ensuing, to be equally divided and appropriated, between the five school districts in the same manner, it was divided & appropriated the year last past, - 500. 00

also Granted the sum of \$25. 00 for the purpose of supplying the five school districts with wood, for the year ensuing to be equally divided, between said districts - 25. 00

6th Granted the sum of \$900. 00 for the support of the Poor, belonging to said Town for the year ensuing - 900. 00

7th Granted to pay their Treas^r the sum of 10. 00
To pay their Assessors 30. 00

8th Article The Town by their vote directed their selectmen, to agree with, and hire some suitable person, to perform the services -
