1st Attended to the Report of the Committee, appointed for the purpose of settling with Doct^r. Robbins & Capt. Jeph Goodnow of Roxborough, for the Loss of said Robbins Horse, by breaking his Leg in a Stone Sluice Near Doct^r. Hidders, who reported that the Value put upon said Horse, by said Robbins amounted to \$50. — then the Town, by their Vote — Granted the aforesaid sum of \$50. for the purposes aforesaid, and Directed their Com^{tee} to settle with said Robbins upon as much easier terms as they possibly could as it Respects the Interest of the Town, — \$50. —

— Then the Town, by their vote, directed that the Pamphlets Containing certain documents, from the President of the United States, and directed to the Town of Sudbury, for public use be deposited in the Town Clerks Office — then the Town, at the request, of said Clerk, Exempted him, from taking the charge of said Pamphlets, and M^r. Asahel Wheeler Jun^r was appointed in his stead, and directed, to deliver out said Books, to the Inhabitants of said Town, on application to him made for that purpose, and not but one of said Pamphlets to be taken out, by any one person at a time, and to be returned in again at the expiration of the term of two days — also that there shall be a Minute made, of each person, to whom said pamphlets shall be delivered.
