

March Anno Domini 1809

Present year, from the first Day of April, to the last day of Sept.

5th To see, if the Town will give liberty, for sheep to go at large, from the 15th Day of March to the first Day of May Next,

6th To see, if the Town, will accept the settlement of the selectmen with the Town Treasurer, and order the same to be recorded,

7th To see if the Town, will appoint some suitable persons for a school Committee and authorize them to agree with and hire school Instructors to instruct the public Schools in said Town the year ensuing, to do - or - act, as the Town shall think best when met,

8th To see, if the Town, will take any Measures for the purpose of agreeing with some suitable person, or persons, for Collector, or collectors, to collect the Taxes assessed upon the Inhabitants of said Town, for the year ensuing to, do - or, act &c &c

9th To see, if the Town will give any encouragement, further than Government has given, to this Towns proportion of Soldiers that are called upon to hold themselves in Readiness at the shortest Notice (provided they are called upon to go into actual service) and appropriate a suitable sum of Money for the same, to do - or act &c &c

10th To see, if the Town will Grant a suitable sum of Money, for the purpose of repairing the road leading from Mr. Isaac Wheelers to Shermans Bridge, (so called) and Direct their surveyors to expend said Grant upon the aforesaid road, it being Agreeable to the request of Mr. Isaac Wheeler, to do - or act, &c &c

11th To see, if the Town, will take any Measures for the purpose of discharging a Demand made by the Heirs of Jonathan Hoar, late of Concord, for his Boarding, Nursing and Doctoring, Jeremiah Robbins in the year 1805, to do, or act &c
