Sudbury Monday May 1st 1809

The foregoing Notification has been posted up at the desire of the Selectmen, and agreeable to a former vote of the Town in P^r Reuben Maynard, J. Clerk.

Warning accepted

At a Legal Town Meeting held in Sudbury on Monday the 1st Day of May 1809, Provided to the business of said day, by bringing in their votes, for the choice of a Representative, and M^r William Hunt, being a Freeholder, and Resident in said Town, was made choice of to serve for, & Represent said Town, in General Court, for the year ensuing, having the number of 80 Votes 1st then provided & took up the 1st Article, under the order for the other Meeting, and made choice of M^r William Hunt for their Moderator.

9th Article in the warning of March Meeting, and referred to May Meeting, as contained in this 1st article

Granted the sum of \$36⁰⁰ as a bounty to this Towns proportion of soldiers, that are called upon to hold themselves in readiness, at the shortest notice, being eighteen in number, also by their vote, directed the Commanding Officer, of each respective Company, to make out a Return, to the Selectmen, of the Name of each soldier that now holds himself in readiness, as Express in this 9th Article and the Selectmen to make out an order, to each respective soldier upon the Town Treas^r for the payment of the said sum amounting to two Dollars per Man; — \$36⁰⁰ 2^d Article left open, to bring in Town Debt, as Quasior may offer

3^d Granted the sum of \$246⁶⁷ as a Salary to the Rev. M^r Biglow for the year ensuing 246, 67
Also, Granted as a Gratuity to the Rev. M^r Biglow the sum of \$86⁶⁷ provided he supplies the Pulpit, for the year ensuing 86, 67
