5th Article, Voted, that Cattle & Horses should be restrained from going at large without a keeper the present season

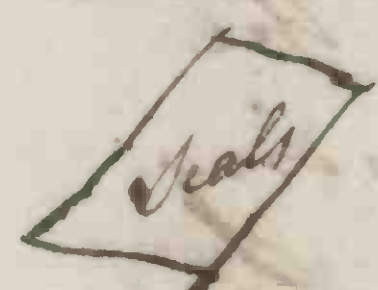

 You are hereby required in the Name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, to Notify, and warn, the Male Inhabitants of said Town, being twenty One years of age, and resident in said Town, for the space of one year next preceding, having a freehold Estate within said Town, of the annual Income of three pounds, or any Estate, to the Value of sixty pounds, to Meet, at the Meeting-House in said Town, on Thursday the 17th Day of May at 12 o'clock at Noon, for the purpose of choosing, one or more Representatives to Represent them at the General Court, appointed to be convened and held at Boston, on the last Wednesday of May

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
