Pines to Stone line, — who Reported that he had attended to said business, agreeable to appointment, and stated to the Court the circumstances of the business, and that he thought it very probable from what was intimat-
ed to him. That would Nothing further be done excepting imposing a small fine perhaps \$10- or \$15. upon said Town.

Also Granted the sum of \$15. for the purpose of Defraying the probable expense that may arise upon said Town in consequence of said Indictment 15, "

15th Noted, that the Clerk of said Town, for the future, post up a Copy of the warrant, for warning Town Meetings, in the Box, for that purpose, two Sabbaths previous to the holding such Meeting, and that he keep the Original under his own care untill such time as the Meeting is to be held.
