These are to notify and warn, the Freeholders, and

the purpose of hiring some suitable person to
preach, during the fall and winter Months, and Grant
a suitable Sum of Money for the same; Provided
the Rev^d M^r Bigelow Continues to be unable to
Perform said Service, to do or act, as the Town
shall think best when Met,
- 3^d To see, if the Town will Grant a suitable Sum
of Money, for the purpose of taking up outstand-
ing orders, to do or act &c &c
- 4th To see, if the Town will agreeable to the re-
quest of the Singing Society, Grant a Suita-
ble Sum of Money, for the purpose of hiring
some suitable person to teach a Singing
School in said Town, to do or act &c &c
