To Ruben Maynard of the Town of Sudbury, Greeting,

Seals You are hereby Required in the Name of the Com=
=monwealth of Massachusetts, to Notify and warn,
the Freeholders, and Other Inhabitants of the Town, of
Sudbury, Qualified by Law to Vote in Town Meetings, Viz^t such
as pay to one Single Tax, besides the poll, or polls, a sum
Equal to two thirds of a single poll Tax, (by posting up a Cop=
=py of the Original, agreeable to the order of the Town) to
Assemble at the Meeting=House in Said Town, on Monday
the 5th Day of November next, at 2 o'clock in the af=
=ternoon, to act on the following Articles Viz^t —

1st To Choose a Moderator — — — —

2^d To see, if the Town will Discount, to Constable Wal=
=ter Haynes, for the year 1809, Such taxes as he holds
against certain persons belonging to said Town as shall
appear to be unable to pay the same, or that are un=
=reasonably taxed, to do or act as the Town, shall think
best when Mett, — — — —

3^d To see, if the Town will agreeable to the request of
Constable Walter Haynes, Direct their Treas^r to Receive
a certain five Dollar Bill, which he took in the Collection
of taxes, to do, or, act &c &c — — — —

4th To see, if the Town, will take any Measures, for the per=
=formance of securing, for the support, of the Widow Jane Brown,
her proportion, which by Law, she is entitled to, of her
son Abel Brown's Estate late of Boston, Deced^d, which
he did seiz^d of, to do, or act, &c &c — — — —

5th To see, if the Town, will give any directions with re=
=gard to the Intermision, between exercises, on the
Lords Days, During the Winter Season, Next ensue=
=ing, to do or act, &c — — — —
