(Seals) You are hereby Required, in the Name of the Com-
monwealth of Massachusetts, to Notify and warn the
Freeholders, and other Inhabitants, of said Town, Quali-
fied, by Law to Vote, in Town Meetings, Viz^t. Such as pay to
one single tax, besides the poll, or poll, a sum equal to two
thirds of a single Poll Tax, (by posting up a Copy of the
same) agreeable to the order of the Town) to assemble at
the Meeting House in said Town, on Monday the 24th.
(Day of this Instant December, at 1 o'clock in the after-
noon, to act on the following articles, Viz^t. -

1st To Choose a Moderator

2^d To see, if the Town, will take any Measures for the
purpose of procuring some suitable person to supply
the Desk, during the Towns pleasure, and Grant a suitable
sum of Money to defray the expense of the same, it
being agreeable to the Petition of M^r. Abel Wheeler Jr.
and others, reference thereunto being had, to do or
act, as the Town shall think best when Mett,
