At a Town Meeting Legally held in Sudbury on Monday the 24th Day of December 1810, Provided & took up the 1st Article and made choice of Mr. William Hunt for their Moderator

2^d The Town by their Vote, appropriated the sum of \$26 (it being the sum that was granted, in Sept^r. Last as a gratuity to the Rev^d. Mr. Bigelow) for the purpose of Defraying the expense of hiring preaching During the present winter season.

It was also voted to appoint a Committee, for the purpose of procuring some suitable person, or Persons for to preach, During the present winter, said Committee to consist of three, and the following Persons were appointed Viz^t Col^o. Rice Mr. Luther Goodnow, and Deacon

Walker, and authorized for the purposes aforesaid.

It was also Voted that there should be but one exercise on the Lord's Day, during the present winter season Meeting, to begin at about half after 11, or 12 o'clock, at Noon, on said Days.

Also by their Vote Directed their Committee to call on the Rev^d. Mr. Bigelow, for the purpose of conferring with him upon the subject Matter whether he should be willing to Deliver up his charge as a Minister of said Town, (provided he should continue to be unable to preach) and be satisfied, if the Town should think advisable, to have some other person.
